## Meet Our New President, Penny Nice

At the September 11, 2012 Annual Dinner Meeting leadership of OCALS passed from Rosemarie Ruck to Penny Nice. Penny is a

native of Medina, NY having graduated from Medina High School. She then did her undergraduate and graduate studies at SUNY College at Brockport in Elementary Education with a minor in sociology.

Penny taught in the primary grades for 32 years at Lyndon-ville Central School. While at LCSD she served on the Effective Schools Leadership Team and presented workshops with the First Grade Team at area literacy conferences. Penny also served as part of the Reading First Leadership Team.

Following retirement Penny became involved in the leadership team for After School Adventures, an after school program at Brockport Free Methodist Church in partnership with Brockport Central School and funded by federal grant monies.

Currently, Penny and her husband reside in Albion operating Nice Farms. She has been an OCALS Board member since May 2010, serving on the Program Committee and assisting with the development of the OCALS Family Literacy Program. Penny is one of the Early Childhood Tutors volunteering at the Agri-Business Child Development Center in Holley known as Grace's Place.

#### OCALS FAMILY LITERACY PROGRAM: Partnership at Grace's Place Update

It has been one year since the OCALS Board put into motion the efforts to develop a partnership with the Agri-Business Child Development Center at Holley, known as Grace's Place, to pilot our initial phase of a Family Literacy Program.

With a mission to provide opportunities to families that give them the ability to learn and from Penny Nice for their support grow together ensuring the cycle of learning passes from generation to generation, OCALS'

have a common interest in supporting literacy needs of families. These partnerships facilitate the necessary collaboration among families, service providers and community agencies in the sharing of information, resources, experience and knowledge.

With the allocation of grant monies from the United Way of Orleans County to fund needed resources and supplies, we forged a partnership with Grace's Place to provide Early Childhood Tutors to support their Kindergarten Readiness goals. OCALS brought Pamela Foss of Medina on board as Family Literacy Program Director and April Fuller of Albion assumed the role of Home Connection Coordinator. The program at Grace's Place commenced on March 26, 2012 with 4 volunteers tutoring 10 students preparing to enter Kindergarten, and 6 three and four year olds for a story time.

The results of our post-assessment, as well as those done by Grace's Place, showed significant growth in meeting the Kindergarten Readiness goals. At the Fall meeting of the Education Advisory Committee at Grace's Place we also heard positive comments from one of our student's parents on their observations of her child's readiness for school.

After a short break to allow for class transitions at Grace's Place we kicked-off the 2012-2013 year on September 24<sup>th</sup> and currently have 3 tutors working with 20 students. The Family Literacy Program Director manages day to day operation of the program and provides monthly Tutor Trainings. Our Home Connection Coordinator is working with eight families and will be present at the November Parent Night, along with the Family Literacy Program Director, to provide information and sign up new families.

We are currently recruiting Early Childhood Tutors to serve either as full time tutors or to act as substitutes. Please contact Pam Foss at 585-813-8350 or Barb Dunham at 585-798-4935.
